The Global Alliance for Chronic Diseases (GACD), in collaboration with Thailand's Health Systems Research institute (HSRI) and Mahidol University (MU) will hold a 5-day implementation science school in Bangkok, Thailand from 5-9 November 2019. This 5-day training school will be facilitated by some of the field's most prominent global experts and aims to train early- and mid-career researchers about the field of dissemination and implementation science and how to: study and implement research findings into policy and practice; use theoretical models, research designs and measurement; and collaborate and network globally.

Sixty participants from Thailand, other ASEAN countries and internationally will be selected for the training school. Eligible participants will include early- and mid-career researchers who have/are:

- Completed and/or are undertaking postgraduate coursework/research studies related to one of the health sciences or public health (or another relevant field).
- Recently graduated PhDs in a field relevant to implementation science.
- Other relevant graduates with up to 5 years of relevant research experience.

(Pending exceptional circumstances, only 1 applicant per institute/centre will be accepted. Attendees from the 2018 Implementation Science School will not be eligible for this event. Preference will be given to applicants from LMIC and/or early- and mid-career researchers undertaking their research with low-income/vulnerable populations.)

There will not be any cost for the training school, however, except for trainees from Thailand and ASEAN countries – who might be eligible for some financial support – other international trainees will be responsible for their travel and the cost of local accommodation. The school will be held at Mahidol University, Salaya Campus and accommodation will be available at a local hotel. Accommodation is expected to be approximately 2000 Baht per person/night (USD65 approx.), including breakfast.
